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Overview

Legal guardianship gives an adult the right to consent to medical treatment for a minor. This includes the ability to help make care decisions regarding medication(s), surgeries and other procedures, diagnostic tests, etc.

A mature minor can provide their own consent when it is determined that they understand and appreciate the nature, risks, and consequences of the proposed procedure/treatment. A legal guardian cannot override the decision of a mature minor.

Release of Information

The following documents are needed for access to be granted to a minor's health information:

- Copies of relevant court orders
- Government issued photo ID
- Signed consent from the primary parent/guardian or mature minor authorizing information be released to you (this can be limited to certain information and/or certain dates)

Acceptable Documents

Present one of the following documents as proof of custody and/or guardianship:

- Child Guardianship signed by a judge
- Custody and Access Order signed by a judge
- A Consent Order that specifies ability to make healthcare decisions or gives access to minor's health information signed by a judge
- A Parenting Order (requires a formal
 agreement between parents) that details the
 guardians' arrangement on how they will
 handle decision making for the healthcare of
 the minor
